### Bou in Kiev...Again

Ashlar-Vellum president, Robert Bou, was back in Kiev, Ukraine this month working with our staff to help ready the beta build for Cobalt, Xenon and Argon v8, SP3. This release will include proper flattening of the perspective view to create PDFs, and a complete overhaul of the underlying infrastructure for exporting bit-mapped graphics in support of the latest Mac operating systems, such as Lion and Mountain Lion.

In addition, Robert was working with our developers on a number of ongoing projects including:

- Reviewing the beta build of Graphite v8 SP4 which contains several bug fixes and the implementation of the new "phone-home" security system.
- Developing the potential feature list for Graphite v9, somewhat focused on 3D for the AEC industry. (Think SketchUp, not SolidWorks.)
- Refining the future feature list for Cobalt, Xenon and Argon v9, including sheet metal commands and improved general CAD tools such as Bill of Materials.
- Completing the beta release of the Zünd Adobe Illustrator plug-in.
- Work on the custom 3D product for the photogrammetric and AEC industries.

## Carton Ideen

Ashlar-Vellum management team Robert Bou and Julie Bou visited with Josef Weber of Carton Ideen earlier this month in Pfyn, Switzerland. Weber shared with them a number of his innovative ideas for product presentation, direct mail and other out-of-the-ordinary packaging ideas. Most of these are fabricated in small quantities (10 to 1000) in their offices using digital printers and Zünd cutting tables. Also discussed were ideas for the future version 9 of AlphaCorr Rules (and indirectly Graphite) software.

## Release of Graphite v8 SP4

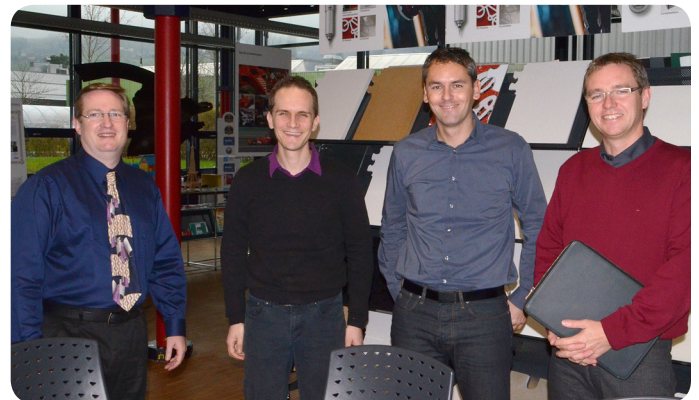
The anticipated release of Graphite v8 SP4 r0 is still pending and by now you should be testing the beta. Some of the features included in this service pack will be:

- Updated and enhanced PDF export functionality.
- Updated palettes for dimensioning tools and saving.
- A new installer.
- Streamlined user security.
- More flexible undo functions.
- Code Signatures for both Apple and Microsoft operating systems for easier installations.

## Zünd Adobe Plug-in Release

Oliver Zünd, Lars Bendixen and Roman Hasler, of Zünd Systemtechnik AG, were visited by Ashlar-Vellum's Robert Bou and Julie Bou this month in the Zünd offices in Altstätten, Switzerland. The Zünd team reviewed the beta version of the custom Adobe Illustrator plug-in developed by Ashlar-Vellum. Now the Ashlar-Vellum development staff is completing the addition of the ECMA 2009 and 1992 catalogs for a future version.

New ideas for other parametric plug-ins for Adobe Illustrator are high on Ashlar-Vellum's list for future development.
